This shoreline was inspected on the ground on April 12, 2011 and as a result, the proposed shoreline was determined to be in an acceptable location. However, several potentially unauthorized land uses consisting of a wire fence, rat traps, irrigation lines, sprinkler heads, torch, fertilizer, and recently planted vegetation, e.g. coconut trees (see enclosed photos) were discovered on or makai of the shoreline.

Since documents permitting the land uses were not submitted with the shoreline certification application, the land uses may be unauthorized. Hawaii Administrative Rules Section 13-222-19 requires the status of these land uses be resolved before the shoreline application may be certified. You may resolve issues with potentially unauthorized land uses by providing a permit issued by an appropriate regulatory agency; by establishing nonconforming status through the Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands or your county planning department; by acquiring a new after-the-fact permit from your county planning department, if they will grant one; or by removal of the materials from, on, or makai of the shoreline.

After completion of the above, please submit confirmation of the resolution of all unauthorized land uses so that the certification process can be completed.
